samples to expire before analysis could be completed. A	s well, the laboratory faile	d to alert JUI of the need	to recollect the samples before
the compliance period ended. JUI was able to confirm t	he samples met regulatory	levels, but were not credi	ted for the samples since the
compliance deadline had passed. No further action is re	quired at this time.		
Violation 27 & 3A – Samples for both were col	lected together during the	month of January 2023; he	owever, they were labelled
incorrectly on compliance reports and thus not counted t	oward the regulatory requ	rements. The mislabeling	was not identified until after the
due date for compliance reporting and were then ineligible	ole for relabeling. As the sa	ample results were in rang	e of the regulation, no further
